

ORDINANCE NO. 74

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DOVER, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, REQUIRING THAT HOME DAY CARE PROVIDERS CARING FOR FOUR OR MORE CHILDREN MEET THE STANDARDS FOR LICENSURE BY THE STATE OF IDAHO; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALING ORDINANCE PROVISIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council as follows:

Any home, place or facility providing day care for between four (4) or more children not related by blood or marriage to the person or persons providing the care, in a place other than the child's or children's own home or homes, and which is not required to be licensed by the State of Idaho under Title 39, Chapter 11, Idaho Code, shall be required to meet the licensing standards set out in Title 39, Chapter 11, and any other applicable ordinances of the City and provide proof of compliance with those standards to the City prior to providing such day care. The penalties for violation of this section shall be the same as those set forth in Title 39, Chapter 11.


The ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

All provisions of the current ordinances of the City of Dover which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage, approval and publication in one issue of the Bonner County Daily Bee, hereby declared the official newspaper of such said City.

Passed under suspension of the rules upon which a roll call vote was taken and duly enacted an ordinance of the City of Dover, Bonner County, Idaho at a convened meeting held on the 11th day of November, 2004.
